One cannot speak about **Peace and Sport** without mentioning the remarkable Lord Philip Noel-Baker who remains the only Olympian (Silver Medal , 1500m Antwerp 1920) and Nobel Peace Prize laureate (1959).

Man of Sport - Captain of the British Olympic team, Vice-President of the British Olympic Association, First President of UNESCO's International Council of Sport and Physical Education (ICSPE).

Man of Peace - Member of Parliament, four times a Minister; major role in drafting the League of Nations Charter, author of *The Arms Race* (1958), Founder of World Campaign for Disarmament (WCD), Vice-President of the International Peace Bureau (IPB).
