Mr. Alfredo Ferrariz Lubang is the Regional Representative of Nonviolence International - Southeast Asia (NISEA). NISEA endeavours to strengthen the ability of human society to use the power of nonviolence to bring about change which reflects truth, justice, and the desire for human development at the personal, social, economic and political levels.

Previously, he served as Director of the Peace Advocacy and Networking Program of the Gaston Z. Ortigas Peace Institute (GZOPI), a leading peace institute in the Philippines.

He also served as the Convenor and the National Coordinator of the Philippine Action Network on Small Arms (PHILANSA), a growing network of nongovernment organizations and peace advocates working and served as a member of the board of the International Action Network on Small Arms (IANSA)- London.

As a peace researcher, he has been the Landmine Monitor researcher on the Philippines, Malaysia and Brunei since 1998 and a member of the Executive Committee of the Philippine Campaign to Ban Landmines. He has also been involved with several researches on issue on disarmament, demobilization and reintegration (DDR), democratization, civil society, conflict resolution and peace processes, in general.

Currently, he is a member of the Advisory board of the International Campaign to Ban Landmines (ICBL), 1997 Nobel Peace Prize Laureate. He is one of the co-founders of the South-South Network on Nonstate Armed Groups Engagement (SSN), is a new region-anchored initiative from the global South (e.g. Asia, Africa and Latin America) which seeks to pay more attention to and develop more effective approaches, instruments and intellectual resources for the constructive engagement of non-state armed groups (NSAGs).

As a peace advocate and educator, he has been actively involved on several fronts, namely: disarmament networks, promotion of the culture of peace, the peace educators network. He has been active in leading trainings and workshops on peace and nonviolence. He is currently co-teaching a peace and human rights course at the Graduate studies on Human Rights at Mahidol University, Thailand.
